



RUNNING EXAMPLE

Lendari sweeps its undeclared usage in April 2026, before deploying Margaux. 47 uses surfaced in 3 weeks.

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1 THE RULE · LOOK FOR THE USAGE, NOT THE CULPRIT

WHY USAGE HIDES

Someone who saves 2 hours a day does not give it up because a memo forbids it, they stop mentioning it. The sweep therefore runs with no sanction announced, otherwise it measures people's caution rather than their practice.

WHAT IS MEASURED

Three things only: which data leaves the organisation, which act reaches a third party unreviewed, and which work already depends on a tool nobody maintains.

Drafting support replies in a consumer assistant	6 people in support	Customer name, order and address	Stopped, replaced by the approved tool

Analysing customer reviews	Marketing	Public reviews, pseudonyms	Kept, on condition of anonymised export
Generating campaign visuals	Studio	None	Kept, disclosure required on publication
Screening job applications	1 recruiter	CVs, sensitive data	Stopped, non-delegable zone (ACF-O4, part B)

3 CHECK WHEN RE-READING

THE FIGURE THAT MATTERS

Not the number of tools found, but the number of uses stopped with nothing put in their place. At Lendari, 2 out of 47, and each got an approved tool within the month.

THE FREQUENCY

The sweep is repeated, because usage re-forms. A single sweep gives a snapshot; two give a trend, which is the only useful thing.

Banning without offering an alternative does not remove the usage, it moves it out of sight.
